# High Sheriff's fund supports 14 charities

Fourteen charities whose work is set to benefit the county's young people were given a total of more than £70,000 by the High Sheriff last night.

Henry Cator held a special reception at Norwich Cathedral where he presented the good causes with cheques ranging from £1,000 to £5,000 thanks to fundraising events and donations made to his Nourishing Norfolk Fund.

The High Sheriff said during his year in office he had repeatedly been left feeling "humble and small" by the great work going on around the county.

Speaking to the many charity representatives gathered in the Weston Room last night, he said: "One of the things one realises as

High Sheriff is that Norfolk is held together by the people who volunteer. The voluntary sector is so important. It's the glue, the cement that keeps the bricks of this county together."

Among the beneficiaries of the Nourishing Norfolk Fund was the Matthew Project.

As chief executive Rosalie Weetman collected the cheque, Mr Cator told her she was doing "really valuable work".

Miss Weetman said the High Sheriff had been out to see the Voicebox caravan, which travels to remote parts of rural Norfolk to listen to young people and offer them advice and support.

She said: "We will put this money towards buying a new trailer and, when we are in a position to buy a new trailer, we will get the young people to design what it looks like on the inside."

Paton was also charged with assault on a man in his seventies.


Broome was also charged with possession of heroin.
